UGC has notified University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020 on 04.09.2020 in the Gazette of India.

In continuation to previous Commission orders under reference (1) and (2), it is informed that the Commission in its 550<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2021 has decided as under:

***"....to exempt the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), New Delhi, a university established under the IGNOU Act, 1985 (50 of 1985), from the application of UGC (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) Regulations, 2020, with effect from the date of Gazette Notification of the said Regulations i.e. 4<sup>th</sup> September, 2020, academic session 2020-2021 and onwards till further orders...."***

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# 1 THE UNIVERSITY

## 1.1 Introduction

The Indira Gandhi National Open University was established by an Act of Parliament in 1985 to achieve the following objectives:

- ❑ democratising higher education by taking it to the doorsteps of the learners,
- ❑ providing access to high quality education to all those who seek it irrespective of age, region, religion and gender,
- ❑ offering need-based academic programmes by giving professional and vocational orientation to the courses, and
- ❑ promoting and developing distance education in India.

## 1.2 Prominent Features

IGNOU has certain unique features such as:

- ❑ National jurisdiction with international presence
- ❑ Flexible admission rules
- ❑ The programmes are offered in compliance to NEP 2020 Guidelines
- ❑ Individualised study: flexibility in terms of place, pace and duration of study

## 1.4 The Schools of Studies

With a view to develop interdisciplinary programmes, the University operates through its Schools of Studies. ## 1.5 Academic Programmes

The University offers Certificates, Diplomas, Advance Diplomas, Post Graduate Diplomas and Degrees, which are conventional as well as innovative. Most of these programmes have been developed after need based survey for such programmes. They are launched with a view to fulfilling the learners' needs for:

- ❑ certification,
- ❑ improvement of skills,
- ❑ acquisition of professional qualifications,
- ❑ continuing education and professional development at workplace,
- ❑ self-enrichment,
- ❑ diversification and updating of knowledge, and
- ❑ empowerment.

## 1.6 Modular Approach to Programmes

The Programmes offered by the University are in compliance to the National Education Policy 2020. The teaching-learning arrangements in IGNOU are highly flexible. With this objective in mind, the University has followed a modular approach to Programme development for many of its degree level programmes. As per the University policy, programmes with modular approach are designed keeping in mind the need of the learners and offer the flexibility in the combination of courses as well as methods. The learners have the choice to decide the pace of their learning and they have the option of course-wise registration for various programmes.

Under the modular approach, each course is allocated a certain credit weightage. A learner enrolled in a modular programme can exit the programme at designated points and obtain a certificate or diploma, depending on the number of credits completed.. Alternately depending on the number of credits earned, a learner with Certificate level can complete a Diploma or a Degree.

In IGNOU, modularity has been implemented in two ways. In some Programmes, exit options have been provided whereby students not wanting to complete the entire programme can make an exit after completion of a



defined number of courses and get a Diploma / PG Diploma. This helps the students in meeting their immediate professional requirement.

In the other approach to modularity, students completing a Diploma / PG Diploma Programme are allowed lateral entry in a degree programme. This helps the students in upgrading their knowledge / skill as per their requirement and convenience.

## 1.7 Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit Points

In keeping with the spirit of the National Educational Policy – 2020 and the National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF), the undergraduate programmes offered by the University follow a modular approach and multiple exists and multiply entries are allowed to facilitate the professional journey of the learners. The Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit facility will be available in the University for BAG,BCOMG,BSCG and BCA Programmes with effect from July 2022 admission cycle.

The details of the exit points and certification at different levels are given below:

**Levels of Multiple Exit and Multiple Entry points**

Sr No.	Level of the Programme	Exit and Certification
1.	Undergraduate Certificate	The learners successfully completing first year (2 semesters) of study at the undergraduate level will be awarded an Undergraduate Certificate. (Total Credits : 40 - 44)
2.	Undergraduate Diploma	The learners successfully completing the 2 years (4 semesters) of study at the undergraduate level will be awarded an Undergraduate Diploma. (Total Credits : 80 - 88)
3.	Undergraduate Degree	The learners successfully completing the 3 years (6 semesters) of study at the undergraduate level will be awarded a general Degree Bachelor's Degree in the disciplines studied. (Total credits : 120- 132)

## 1.8 Course Preparation

Learning material is specially prepared by teams of experts drawn from different universities and specialized institutions in the area spread throughout the country as well as in-house faculty. The material is scrutinized by the content experts, in-house faculty and edited by the language experts at IGNOU before these are finally sent for printing. Similarly, audio and video materials are produced in consultation with the course writers, in-house faculty and producers. The material is previewed and reviewed by the faculty as well as outside experts and edited/modified, wherever necessary, before they are finally dispatched to the students, Learner Support Centres and Telecast through Gyan Darshan.

## 1.9 Credit System

### a) Defining Credit in ODL

The University follows the 'Credit System' for most of its programmes. Each credit in our system is equivalent to 30 hours of learner study comprising all learning activities (i.e., reading and comprehending the print material, listening to audio, watching video, attending counselling sessions, teleconference and writing assignment responses). Thus, a 4-credit course involves 120 hours of study and a 6-credit course involves 180 hours of study. This helps the learner to know the academic effort he/she has to put in, to successfully complete a course. Completion of an academic programme (Degree or Diploma) requires successful completion of the assignments, practical, projects and the Term-End Examination as per requirement of each course in a programme.

### b) Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

The Bachelor's Degree Programmes offered through this prospectus follow the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) introduced by UGC. The CBCS provides the learner with flexibility to study the subjects/courses at their own pace; greater choice of inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based courses; and mobility to different institutions for studies. The system has the following advantages:

- ❑ Allows learners to choose a combination of inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented courses (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude).
- ❑ Makes education broad-based and at par with global standards.
- ❑ Offers flexibility for learners to study at different times and at different institutions to complete the programme. Credits earned at one institution can be transferred to another institution.

## 1.10 Support Services

In order to provide individualized support to its learners, the University has a large number of Learner Support Centres, spread across the country. These Learner Support Centres are coordinated by 67 Regional Centres and Recognised Regional Centres. At the Learner Support Centres, the learners interact with the Academic Counselors and other learners, refer to books in the Library, watch/listen to video/audio programmes and interact with the Coordinator on administrative and academic matters. The list of Regional Centres is given in this Prospectus. Support services are also provided through Work Centres, Programme Learner Support Centres, Skill Development Centres and Special Learner Support Centres.

**In case the number of students enrolled in a program is small, the University shall provide Technology Enabled Learner Support (TELS) through Gyan Darshan / Gyan Vani / Swayam Prabha/ Web based support.**

## 1.11 Programme Delivery

The methodology of instruction in this University is different from that of the conventional Universities. The Open University system is more learner-oriented and the learner is an active participant in the pedagogical (teaching and learning) process. Most of the instructions are imparted through distance education methodology as per the requirement.

The University follows a multimedia approach for instruction, which comprises:

- a) Self Instructional Printed Material:** The printed study material (written in self-instructional style) for both theory and practical components of the programmes is provided to the learners in the form of a single print book and/or e-book, comprising blocks and units or in the form of separate printed blocks for every course (on an average 1 block per credit). A block which comes in the form of a booklet usually comprises 3 to 5 units.

**Audio-Visual Material Aids:** The learning package contains audio and video programmes which have been produced by the University for better clarification and enhancement of understanding of the course material given to the learners. A video programme is normally of 25-30 minutes duration.

- b)** The Video content is available on eGyan kosh ([www.egyankosh.ac.in](http://www.egyankosh.ac.in)) – the digital learning repository of the University.

**The video programmes are also telecast on National Network of Gyan Darshan and Swayamprabha channels. All Gyan Vani stations broadcast curriculum-based audio programmes as per their schedule that is notified in advance. In addition, some selected stations of All India Radio also broadcast the audio programmes. Learners can confirm the dates for the programmes from their Learner Support Centres. The information is also provided through the university website.**

- c) Counselling Sessions:** Normally counselling sessions are held as per schedule drawn by the Learner Support Centres. These are mostly held outside the regular working hours of the host institutions where the Learner Support Centres are located. **However, in case the number of students in a programme is small, face-to-face counselling shall not be organized. In such cases the University shall provide Web Enabled Academic Support to the learners.**

- d) Tele conferences:** Live sessions are conducted via satellite through interactive Gyan Darshan Channel as well as simultaneously webcast at <http://ignouonline.ac.in/> and via Facebook Live sessions.

- e) Practicals/Project Work:** Some Programmes have practical/project component also depending upon the

learning requirements. Practical sessions are held at designated institutions for which schedule is provided by the Learner Support Centres. Attendance at practical sessions is compulsory. For project work, comprehensive project guide, in the form of a booklet, is provided to the learner along with the study material.

### 1.12 Gyan Darshan

Gyan Darshan (GD) channel is a major milestone in the field of Educational Television in India. It is a joint venture of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Ministry of Information & Broadcasting (I & B Ministry), Prasar Bharati and IGNOU serving as the nodal agency. Launched in the year 2000, GD is a 24-hour educational channel which offers the best of educational programmes covering a variety of subjects and catering to a wide range of viewers. These include pre-school, primary, secondary and higher secondary students, college/university students, youth seeking career opportunities, homemakers and working professionals. The software is pooled from various educational Institutions and Development Organisations. GD conducts two hours of live interactive sessions every day to build interactivity in the Open and Distance Learning (ODL) system. Teachers/Resource persons and IGNOU Regional Center functionaries interact for academic and administrative matters with students. Induction Programmes for new students and convocations for graduating students are also conducted live through Teleconferencing every year.

Gyan Darshan is also available on webcast, thus extending the reach of IGNOU programmes to audiences world over. The Gyan Darshan telecast is also beneficial for students of the formal education system and the viewers can access Gyan Darshan on IGNOU's website <http://gd.ignouonline.ac.in/gyandarshan/>. As Gyan Darshan Channel is must carry channel as per the Government of India Gazette notification, a number of private DTH/Cable Operators carries Gyan Darshan in their Bouquets. Gyan Darshan is now part of Swayam Prabha and can be watched on MHRD Channel no.25

### 1.13 Gyanvani

Gyan Vani (GV) FM Radio was conceived in 2001 as a network of educational FM Radio Channels operating from various cities in the country. With an aim to enhance and supplement the teaching-learning process, each GV Station has a range of about 60 kms and covers an entire city/town including the adjoining rural areas. Gyan Vani serves as an ideal medium for niche audience addressing the local educational, developmental and socio-cultural requirements of the people. The flavor of the channel is by and large local and the medium is English, Hindi or language of the region. The overall content pertains to Primary and Secondary Education, Adult Education, Technical and Vocational Education, Higher Education, Distance Education and Extension Education etc. Interactive Radio Counseling (IRC) facility is being provided by GV Stations to enable students to interact with the faculty, academic counselors and student support staff. The live phone-in programmes are popular components of the network. The programmes broadcast through each stations include both pre-recorded and live content. click the link – ( <http://gd.ignouonline.ac.in/gyandhara/> )

### 1.14 Swayam Prabha

Swayam Prabha is an initiative of the Ministry of Education, Government of India to provide 34 High Quality Educational TV Channels through DTH (Direct to Home) across the length and breadth of the country on 24x7 basis using GSAT 15 Satellite. Curriculum-based course content covering diverse disciplines are telecast through Swayam Prabha and are provided by NPTEL, IITs, UGC, CEC and IGNOU with the objective of meeting the needs of lifelong learners in India and abroad. IGNOU has been entrusted with the responsibility of National Coordinator for Swayam Prabha Project for four channels (CH 17 to 20) which are presently operational with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> Sept., 2020 after reorganization of earlier five channels. These four channels are broadcasting the recorded videos as well as live telecasting of IGNOU programmes on 24x7 basis.

### 1.15 Gyandhara

Gyandhara is an internet audio counseling service offered by IGNOU. Students can listen to the live discussions by the teachers and experts on the topic of the day and interact with them through telephone, email and also chat mode. When live sessions are not on, Gyanvani Delhi is made available on this platform. The Gyandhara streaming is available for internet users anywhere in the world. Important events broadcast by GV Delhi are also relayed by all GV stations using the Gyandhara feed.

## 1.16 Web Enabled Academic Support (WEAS)

To provide technology based academic support to the learners of the distance mode programmes, IGNOU has initiated a scheme of Web Enabled Academic Support (WEAS) for various ODL programmes of IGNOU. WEAS is a Single Window Platform providing various kinds of academic support including the study material, audio-video, quiz, discussion forum, calendar of activities, web-based video counselling, links of various web-based resources to the distance learners by using simple and easily available ICT tools. The students enrolled in programmes being offered through WEAS are given access to their programme specific portal in which they are provided with course material in digital format, video and learning resources. The portal enables online peer-to-peer interaction and discussion, it also gives an opportunity to the students to learn online and interact virtually with teachers and experts. ## 1.17 Evaluation System

The University conducts Term-End Examinations (TEE) twice a year ordinarily in the months of June & December.

The system of evaluation followed by the University also is different from that of conventional universities. IGNOU has a multitier system of evaluation.

1. Self-assessment exercises within each unit of study material.
2. Continuous evaluation mainly through assignments which are tutor-marked, practical assignments and seminar/ workshops/extended contact programmes, etc.
3. Term-End Examinations (TEE).
4. Project / Term-end Practical examination.

The evaluation of learners depends upon various instructional activities undertaken by them. A learner has to write assignment responses compulsorily before taking Term-End Examinations from time to time to complete an academic programme. A learner has to submit Tutor Marked Assignments (TMA) responses to the Coordinator of the Learner Support Centre to which s/he is attached. **Term-end examination is conducted at various examination centres spread all over the country and abroad in June and December every year.**

IGNOU uses the following system of "Grading" for evaluating learners' achievement

For Bachelors' and Masters' degree programmes, normally the system of numerical marking is followed, and the marks secured in assignments, TE Exams, etc. are later converted into grades as per the five-point grading scale given above. However, if required by the learner, the university provides numerical marks and division (I, II or Pass).



IGNOU uses 10-Point Grading System for evaluating learners' achievement for Bachelor Degree Programmes under CBCS, as under:

### Term-End Examination and Payment of Examination Fee

The University conducts Term-end Examination (TEE) twice a year in the months of June & December. A learner is permitted to appear in TEE subject to the following conditions: -

1. Registration for the courses is valid and not time barred.
2. Required number of assignments in the courses have been submitted by due date wherever applicable.
3. Minimum time to pursue these courses as per the provision of the programme has been completed.
4. Examination fee for all the courses the learner is appearing in the examination has been paid.

In the case of non-compliance of any of the above conditions, the result of all such courses is liable to be withheld by the University.

### Term-end Examination

The learners are required to fill in the Examination form to appear in the TEE each time i.e., for every exam (June/ December) a learner has to apply a fresh. The Examination Forms are accepted online only as per the schedule available on the IGNOU website (<https://ignou.ac.in>) from time to time.

The fee applicable to Projects and Practical Exams w.e.f. January, 2023 Admission Cycle shall be as under:

#### a. Project Evaluation Fees

Up to 4 credits project work: 300

The fee is to be submitted by the students along with the Term End Examination form.

#### b. Practical Examination

Fees Up to 4 credits: 300

Above 4 credits: 500

The fee is to be submitted by the students along with the Term End Examination form.

Examination fee once paid is neither refundable nor adjustable even if the learner fails to appear in the examination.

### Hall Ticket for Term End Examination

No hall ticket shall be dispatched to the examinees. Hall Tickets of all examinees are uploaded on the University Website ([www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)) 7-10 days before the commencement of the Term End Examinations. Therefore, learners are advised to visit IGNOU website for updates.

Students are advised to take the print out of the Hall Ticket from University website after entering the enrolment number and name of programme of study, and report at the examination centre along with the Identity Card issued by the University. Without a valid IGNOU Student ID Card issued by the University, examinees will not be permitted to appear in the examination.

In case, any learner has misplaced the Identity Card issued by the University, it is mandatory to apply for a duplicate Identity Card to the Regional Centre concerned well before commencement of the examinations so as to get a duplicate ID Card in time. Learners without valid ID Card will not be allowed to enter the Examination Centre premises. Students who have taken admission online can download their ID Card online.

### 1.18 International Students Residing in India

The foreign nationals are advised to visit the page of International Division of the University (<http://ignou.ac.in/ignou/aboutignou/division/id/introduction>) for the programmes on offer for them; programme fee and other fees applicable for them. They may also contact International Division of the University at the Headquarters for more details.

### 1.19 Online Admission System

The Admission Forms can be submitted online through Online Admission System at <https://ignouadmission.samarth.edu.in/> by the Indian Student. Currently, the facility is available for the programmes offered through Common Prospectus except entrance test based programmes. Foreign student residing in other countries can also join the online programmes and can submit their admission form at <https://ignouforeigniop.samarth.edu.in/>. The prospective learners are required to create their user ID and password for logging in the system and upload the required documents along with the submission of the Admission Form. There is no need to send the printed copy of the Admission Form to the Regional Centre. The programme fee can be paid online using payment Gateway through net banking, debit/credit card or UPI. Once the admission form is submitted online, the students can track the progress of their admission. A message is sent on the mobile number and email ID registered with the System once admission is confirmed. In case of any discrepancy in the Admission Form, the prospective students are advised to remove the discrepancy within a stipulated time. Failing to do so will lead to rejection of admission form.

The prospective learners submitting the Admission Form through this System can download the Prospectus free from IGNOU website <http://www.ignou.ac.in>. However, fee as prescribed from time to time will be charged as registration fee along with the programme fee.

### 1.20 eGyanKosh

The IGNOU eGyanKosh (<http://egyankosh.ac.in/>) is a national digital repository of educational resources in higher education. It is available for the learners and teachers, and public at large for free. The eGyan Kosh currently houses the self-learning material of over 3923 courses of 384 programmes of IGNOU. The IGNOU learners are encouraged to make use of these resources for their learning.

### 1.21 IGNOU e-Content Mobile App

IGNOU-e-Content Mobile App is an official mobile app of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), New Delhi. This app is an ICT initiative of IGNOU to provide Digital Learning Environment to IGNOU learners and extending Technology Enhanced Learner Support Services to them. The aim of this initiative is to disseminate the digitised course material to IGNOU Learners. IGNOU learners can use this app to access their course material through their hand held devices such as Mobile Phones and Tablets.

### 1.22 Library Services

The IGNOU library is the most resourceful information centre in the country in the field of distance education. The collection of printed and electronic resources is quite strong, with 1.5 lakh printed books at IGNOU Headquarters and 2.5 lakh printed books at libraries of RCs and LSCs.

- The University Library provides remote access to 8–10 online databases through the UGC e-Shodh Sindhu Consortium. Users can access over 7900+ e-journals and more than 1700 e-books (<http://www.ignou.ac.in/ignou/aboutignou/division/idd/EResources>) as well as millions of open-access resources in digital form.
- The holdings of the library collection and access to e-resources can be browsed and downloaded from their desktops through WebOPAC (<https://libraryopac.ignou.ac.in/>) and Integrated Search Engines.
- Library is a member of the Developing Library Network (DELNET) (<https://www.delnet.in/>) that provides various resource sharing services like browsing of Union Catalogues, Inter-Library Loan and Document Delivery from more than 7000 member libraries.
- IGNOU is also a member of 'The Daisy Forum of India' (DFI), which provides Sugamya Pustakalaya (<https://library.daisyindia.org/> **NALP/welcomeLink.action**) facilitating access to more than 67,000 books to the blind, people with low vision, or people with any other print disability.
- IGNOU library uploads Ph.D/M.Phil theses on UGC INFLIBNET's "Shodhganga" Repository for digital preservation and ensuring continuous access to scholarly content.
- IGNOU library uses Urkund/Ouriginal software provided by UGC INFLIBNET to check the texts of Research papers/Theses/Dissertations for originality and protect it against potential plagiarism ([ouriginal.com/login/](http://ouriginal.com/login/)).
- Research Scholars can take library membership by paying refundable security deposit of ₹5000 for availing lending services.
- Post graduate students interested in remote access of e-resources should download the form from Link: <http://www.ignou.ac.in/ignou/aboutignou/division/idd/raf>, fill up the same and email to [librarian@ignou.ac.in](mailto:librarian@ignou.ac.in) to facilitate access.

### 1.23 Vidya Lakshmi Portal

Vidya Lakshmi Portal is a first of its kind portal for students seeking Education Loan. Set up in August 2015, it is a single window electronic platform for students to access information and prepare applications for Educational Loans and Government Scholarships. The Portal has the facility of tracking the students right from the inception of loan application until the completion of sanction of loan or otherwise. Students can view, apply and track their education loan applications to banks anytime, anywhere through the Portal. The portal has been developed and being maintained by NSDL e-Governance Infrastructure Limited.

Nearly 40 Banks have registered for over 131 **Educational Loan Schemes** on the Vidya Lakshmi Portal and integrated their system with the Portal for providing loan processing status to students.

### 1.24 Course-wise Registration and Certification Scheme (CRCS)

The University offers a scheme of Course-wise Registration and Certification (CRCS). Under this scheme, one can register for a single course or a limited number of courses, subject to a maximum of 16 credits. The rules of CRCS are as under:

1. The eligibility for registering for a course under the Scheme shall be same as the eligibility for admission to the Programme from where the course(s) are drawn.
2. The Scheme shall be offered in both Cycles of Admission, subject to the provision that the courses are on offer in the particular admission cycle.
3. Registration for all courses of all the academic programmes shall be open for registration under the Scheme except the courses offered under Research Degree Programmes and Awareness/Appreciation level Programmes.
4. Courses offered in combination shall have to be taken together by the student.
5. Course(s) once opted shall not be changed or withdrawn by the student.
6. The minimum and maximum period allowed for completion of the course(s) registered would be six months and two years, respectively.

7. There will be no separate counselling or lab-work schedule for students registered under the Scheme. The registered students under the Scheme shall be advised to be in touch with the Learner Support Centre allocated in order to know the schedule of theory/practical counselling sessions and participate in the sessions accordingly.
8. Candidates registering under the Scheme, for successfully completing the course(s) opted, shall be required to fulfill all the academic requirements as prescribed by the University from time to time.
9. Candidates successfully completing the course(s) opted shall be provided with a Certificate of Completion of Course indicating the score obtained in continuous/term-end assessment and credits earned.
10. The fee chargeable under the Scheme shall be as under:

Credit weightage of each course	Course Fee
Up to 4 credits	Rs.1000/-
Above 4 credits	Rs.2000/-

The fee shall be calculated per course and not on the basis of total number of credits taken. The Course Fee shall be subject to revision and shall be linked with the revision of Programme fee. In addition to the course fee, Registration fee as decided by the University from time shall be chargeable. Fee once paid shall be non-refundable or non-adjustable. Examination fee, as notified by the University from time to time, shall be charged over and above the course fee and registration fee.

11. Candidates shall be allowed to seek transfer of credits earned under the Scheme by taking admission in a Programme of IGNOU subject to the following conditions:
  - a. Fulfillment of all the conditions as notified by the University from time to time for that particular academic programme.
  - b. A maximum of 50% of the credits earned under the Scheme shall be allowed at the time of taking admission in the relevant programme.
  - c. Credits earned for Project or Internship shall not be transferred.
  - d. Transfer of credits earned under the Scheme for an academic programme that falls under the purview of a Regulatory Authority shall be governed by the rules and regulations of the concerned Regulatory Authority.
  - e. Credit transfer of a course shall be permitted on application with requisite fee after taking admission in a programme.
  - f. Credit transfer shall be given only in the courses offered in that programme. In case the completed course under the Scheme is revised, credit transfer shall not be permitted.
  - g. Transfer of credits earned under the Scheme to an academic programme offered by the University in collaboration/under MoU with other Institutions, shall be governed by the terms of collaboration/MoU.
  - h. The UGC framework for Credit Transfer shall be applicable for transfer of credits.
  - i. Application for CRCS can be made online on the Online Admission Portal of the University.
  - j. The facility of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as envisioned in the NEP 2020 is also available for different programmes.

### 1.25 Scheme of Fee Support to SC/ST Students

The University provides exemption of programme fee to students from SC/ST category as per its policy. The policy is reviewed for every admission cycle. Students are advised to visit the University website or contact the Regional Centre to know about the latest provisions. The exemption, if admissible, will be allowed for one programme only.

The following SC and ST students are **not** eligible for fee exemption:

- ☐ who are employed OR



- ☐ who are availing any kind of fellowship or fee exemption from other agencies, OR
- ☐ whose Parents'/ Guardians' income from all Sources exceeds Rs 2.5 lakhs during financial year as per Government of India norms.

The applicants should submit income certificate issued by Authorized Government Agency while taking admission. The exemption of fee is confined to the extent of Programme Fee mentioned in the Prospectus. The students belonging to these categories will have to pay late fee (if any), Term End Examination Fee, convocation fee, Registration fee, etc. since these are not exempted under this Scheme.

**Objectives:** The Bachelors of Arts programme is a broad based programme with a mix of disciplinary, interdisciplinary and skill based courses. It has the following objectives:

1. Introduce the learners to the main themes and topics of disciplines in humanities, social sciences and sciences,
2. Provide the learners with the information and skills necessary to understand and analyse their world,
3. Enable the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
4. Impart reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises of such kind at an undergraduate level.
5. Expose the learner to the importance of interdisciplinarity.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent

**Medium of Instruction:** English & Hindi

Learners opting B.A. Psychology courses with Practicum component are required to pay an extra fee of Rs.600/- in each year.

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners study time. To earn Bachelor's Degree, a learner has to complete 132 credits in minimum six semesters

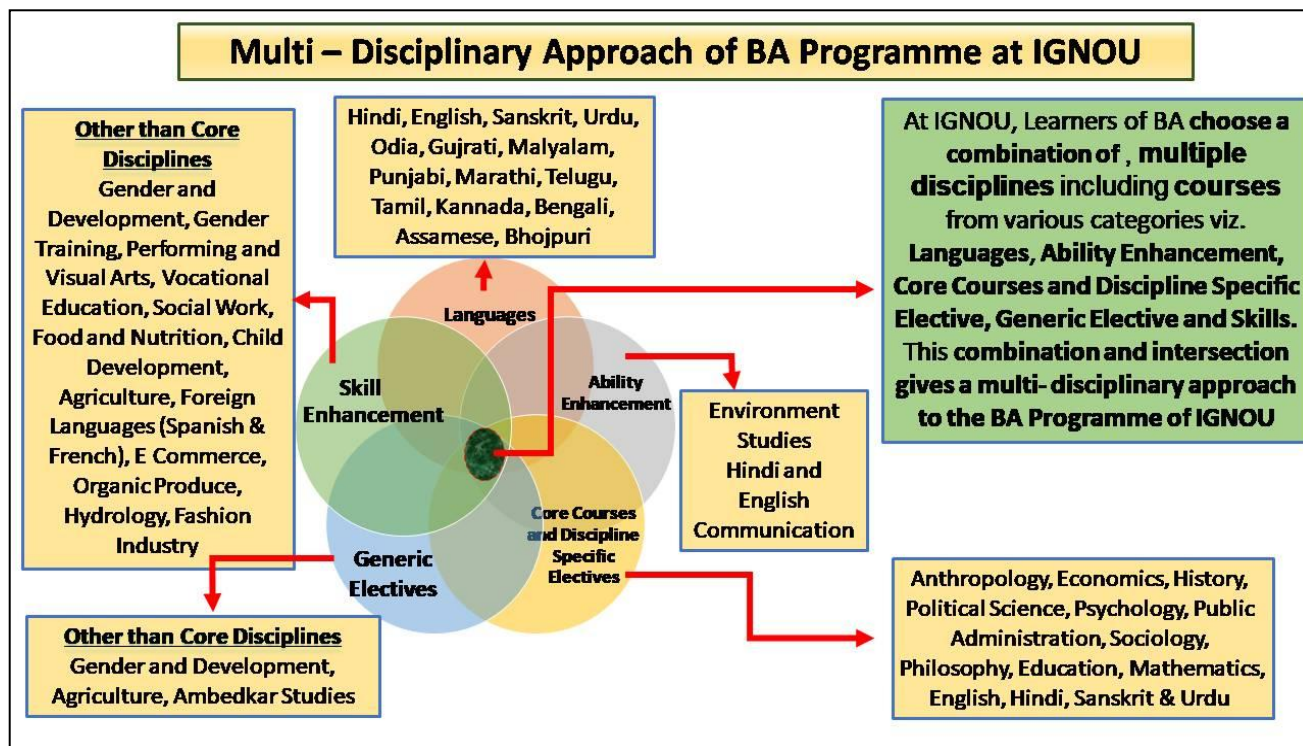
(Three years) with 22 credits per semester. The 132 credits of the programme have to be earned by completing the following categories of courses:

- The programme aims at the development of analytical skills, financial and accounting skills as well as managerial skills.

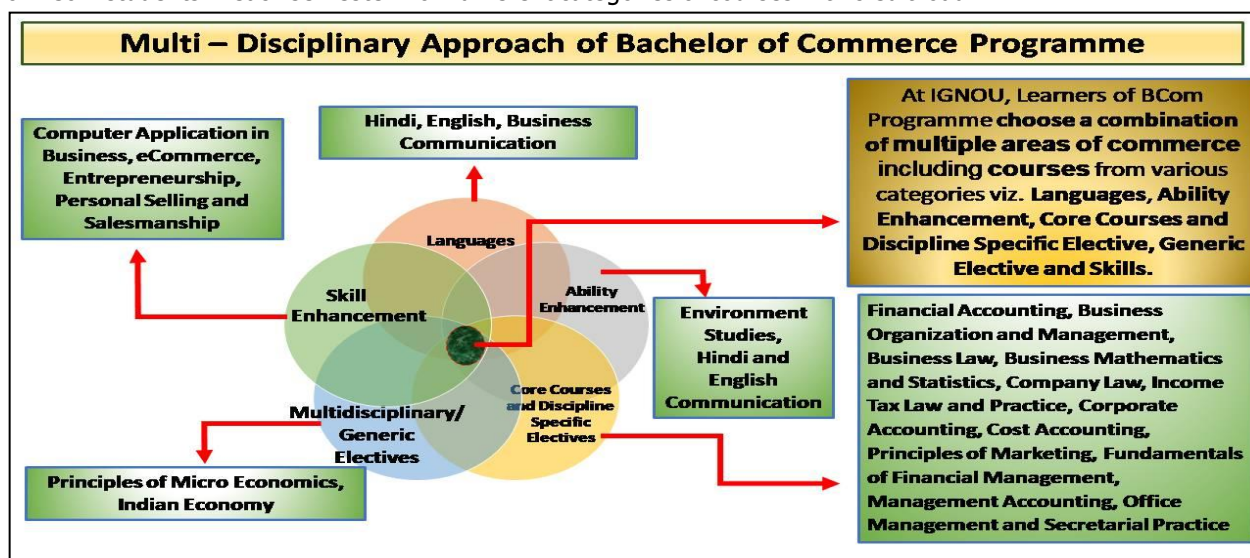

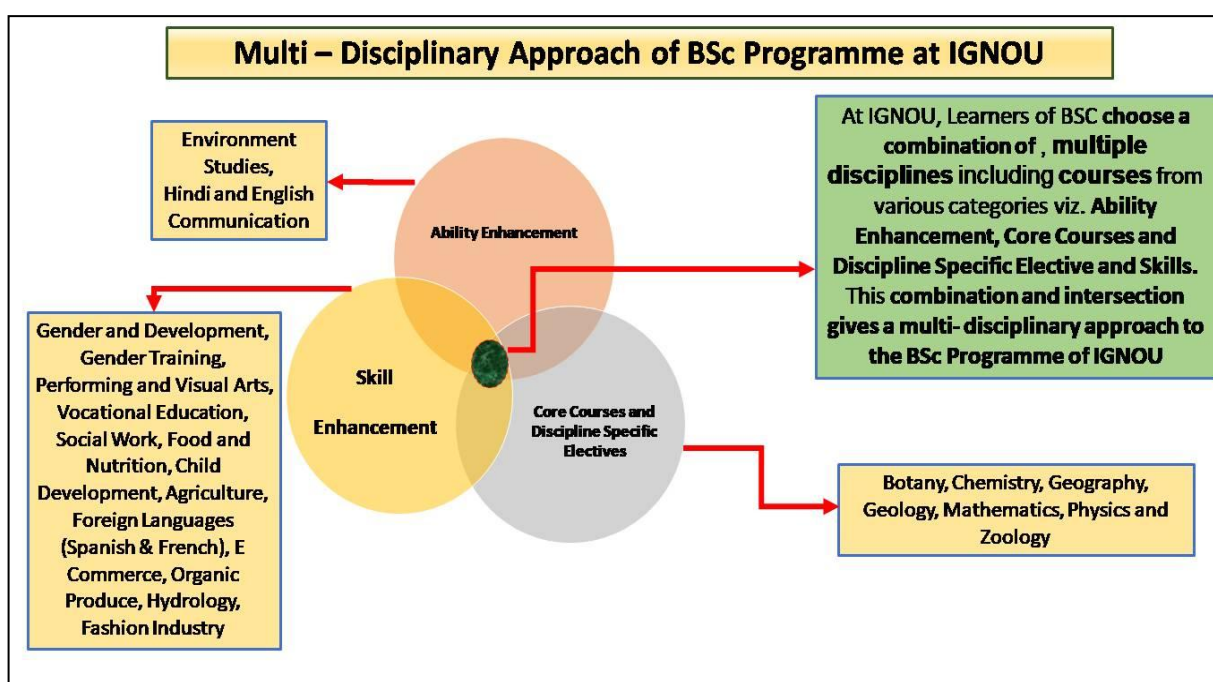

They have to make a conscious decision of choosing the Disciplines they want to study since the Disciplines once chosen in first semester will have to be studied in the subsequent semesters also. In each semester, the students have to choose 4 courses in all from different categories of courses. **The courses given in pairs need to be taken in pairs only.** While the courses under CC and DSE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AEC and SEC are of 4 credits each. Therefore, the study load in each semester will come out to 22 credits. **Medium of Instruction:** English and Hindi

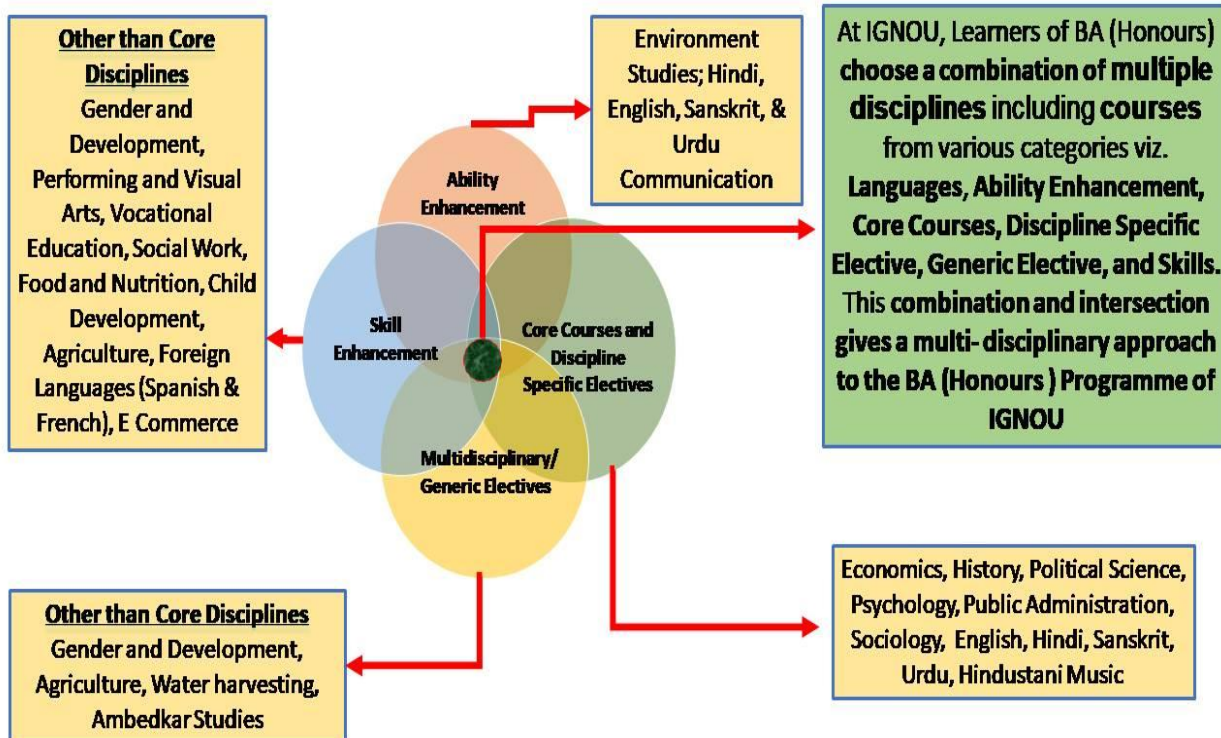
To earn BA (Honours) Degree in a Discipline, a learner has to complete courses worth 148 credits in minimum six semesters (three years). The Honours programmes have a mix of following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (CC)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- e) Generic Electives (GE)

The University follows the credit system for offering all its programmes. One credit is equal to 30 hours of learners study time. To earn Bachelor's Honours Degree, a learner has to complete 148 credits in minimum six semesters. The study load of the Honours programmes vary from semester to semester. Students have to complete 22 credits each in first and second semesters; 28 credits each in third and fourth semesters; and 24 credits each in fifth and sixth semesters. ## 4.10 Bachelor of Arts English (Honours)(BAEGH) School of Humanities (SOH)

The University offers a Bachelor's Honours Degree Programme in English (**BAEGH**) in addition to a number of other disciplines. Information pertaining to the Programme is given below:

**Objectives (BAEGH):** With a substantial number of courses drawn from a single discipline (English), and a few interdisciplinary and skill-based elective courses, the Bachelors Honours programme (English) is designed to give an in-depth knowledge in that discipline while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline as well. The Honours programme has the following general objectives:

1. To introduce the learner to main themes and topics in the discipline of English through core, discipline-centric electives, ability/skill enhancement and generic courses.
2. To facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses in humanities and social sciences.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary study by enabling them to offer courses outside their disciplines.

**Eligibility:** 10+2 or its equivalent

**Medium of Instruction:** English

The Honours programmes have a mix of courses. For earning 148 credits, a student has to study the following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (**CC**)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (**DSE**)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (**AECC**)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (**SEC**)
- e) Generic Electives (**GE**)

### Core Courses (CC)

The programme has 14 core courses. Each core course is of six credits. These courses cover more than half of the programme, 84 credits (14 courses x 6 credits) out of 148 credits of the programme.

### Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)

Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSEs) are on offer in the fifth and sixth semesters of the programme. The 4 DSEs are specific (or specialized or advanced or supportive) to the discipline or subject of study and provide an extended scope. They are of 6 credits each (6 courses x 4 credits) and will thus be 24 credits in all.

### Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses are of four credits each. As the name suggests, the Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are compulsory for all learners. There are two AECCs on offer, one each in the first and second semesters. With one course in the first two semesters each, (2 courses x 4 credits), the AECC courses will add upto 8 credits in all.

### Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are also ability enhancement courses. These are value-based and/or skill-based courses and are designed to develop competencies and skills. Each Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) is of four credits. These courses are on offer in the third and fourth semesters. One SEC in each semester (2 courses x 4 credits) will add up to 8 credits.

### Generic Electives (GE)

Generic Electives (GEs) are the other type of electives that are on offer in the first, second, third and fourth semesters of the programme and are of 6 credits each. These courses are inter-disciplinary in nature and provide an exposure to other disciplines/subjects. With one course in each of the first four semesters, (4 courses x 6 credits), GE will come to 24 credits in all.

### SEMESTER-WISE COURSE OPTIONS

In each semester, the students have to study 4 courses in all from different categories of courses except in the third and fourth semesters when the number of courses goes up to 5. While the courses under CC, DSE and GE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AECC and SEC are of 4 credits each. While the fourteen CCs are distributed across the six semesters, the four DSEs are available in the fifth and sixth semesters only. There will be a number of SECs and the GEs available in the common pool in each of the semesters in which they are offered. A student has to opt for only one GE for study in each of the first four semesters and one SEC during the third and fourth semesters of the programme. The university will be adding new SECs and electives (DSEs and GEs) to the existing pool of courses from time to time. The study load in the first and second semesters will be 22 credits each and while the credit load in the third and fourth semesters will be enhanced to 28 credits each, it will come down to 24 credits each in the fifth and sixth semesters. Thus the total study load will come to 148 credits. The following Table presents the **CODES** and **TITLES** of credit load and semester-wise courses available for BA Honours (English):

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## 4.11 स्नातक उपाधि (ऑनर्स) हिंदी (बीएचडीएच)

### मानविकी विद्यापीठ (एसओएच)

विश्वविद्यालय अन्य विषयों के अलावा हिंदी (बीएचडीएच) में एक ऑनर्स उपाधि कार्यक्रम प्रदान करता है। कार्यक्रम से संबंधित जानकारी नीचे दी गई है:

#### उद्देश्य:

स्नातक उपाधि (ऑनर्स) हिंदी : बी.ए. (हिंदी) ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम एक व्यापक कार्यक्रम है। इसका कोड बी.ए.एच.डी.एच. (BAHDH) है। यह कार्यक्रम हिंदी विषय के गहन अध्ययन पर आधारित कार्यक्रम है जिसमें हिंदी के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों का अध्ययन भी प्रस्तावित है। इस कार्यक्रम में विभिन्न विद्यापीठों से अध्ययन के कई विषय और पाठ्यक्रम शामिल हैं। एक एकल अनुशासन (हिंदी) कुछ अंतरानुशासनात्मक और कौशल आधारित वैकल्पिक पाठ्यक्रमों से तैयार किये गए पाठ्यक्रमों की पर्याप्त संख्या के साथ स्नातक उपाधि ऑनर्स (हिंदी) को उस विशिष्ट अनुशासन (हिंदी) में गहन ज्ञान देने के लिए तैयार किया गया है। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम के निम्नलिखित सामान्य उद्देश्य हैं:

- 1 मुख्य विषय, अनुशासन केंद्रित ऐच्छिक, क्षमता/कौशलवृद्धि और सामान्य पाठ्यक्रमों के माध्यम से हिंदी के अनुशासन में मुख्य विषयों और विषयों के लिए शिक्षार्थी का परिचय कराना।
- 2 मानव और सामाजिक विज्ञान में उपयुक्त पाठ्यक्रमों के लिए जोखिम के माध्यम से क्षमता और कौशल वृद्धि की दिशा में काम करने के लिए शिक्षार्थियों की सुविधा के लिए।
- 3 स्नातक स्तर पर सत्रीय कार्य और अभ्यास के माध्यम से शिक्षार्थियों को पढ़ने और लिखने के कौशल से परिचित कराना।
- 4 शिक्षार्थियों को विषय के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों के अध्ययन की ओर प्रेरित कर के अन्तः विषयी अध्ययन के महत्व में प्रेरित करना।

**पात्रता:** 10+2 या समकक्ष

**शिक्षा का माध्यम:** हिंदी

विश्वविद्यालय अपने सभी कार्यक्रमों के लिए क्रेडिट प्रणाली का अनुसरण करता है। एक क्रेडिट शिक्षार्थी के अध्ययन के समय के 30 घंटे के बराबर है। एक अनुशासन में बीए (ऑनर्स) की डिग्री हासिल करने के लिए, एक शिक्षार्थी को न्यूनतम छह सेमेस्टर (तीन वर्ष) में 148 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम पूरा करना होता है। छात्रों को पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक में 22 क्रेडिट पूरा करना है, तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में 28 क्रेडिट और पांचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर में प्रत्येक में 24 क्रेडिट। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रमों में अंतरविषयी पाठ्यक्रमों का मिश्रण होता है। 148 क्रेडिट अर्जित करने के लिए, एक छात्र को निम्नलिखित श्रेणियों के पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन करना होगा:

- क) अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (सीसी)
- ख) अनुशासन विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक (डीएसई)
- ग) योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (ईसीसी)
- घ) कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)
- ड) सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई)

एक शिक्षार्थी निम्नलिखित विषयों में से किसी एक में बीए ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम चुन सकता है: अर्थशास्त्र, अंग्रेजी, हिंदी, इतिहास, राजनीतिविज्ञान, मनोविज्ञान, लोक प्रशासन और समाजशास्त्र। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रमों का अध्ययन भार प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में भिन्न होता है। एक बार जब अनुशासन चुना जाता है, तो सीखने वाले को सभी सेमेस्टर में केवल उसी अनुशासन से पाठ्यक्रमों (क) अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम और (ख) विषय विशिष्ट वैकल्पिक पाठ्यक्रम लेने अनिवार्य है।

#### अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (सीसी)

कार्यक्रम में मुख्य पाठ्यक्रम अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम है। प्रत्येक अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम छह क्रेडिट का है। ये पाठ्यक्रम कार्यक्रम के आधे से अधिक कवर करते हैं, कार्यक्रम के 148 क्रेडिट में से 84 क्रेडिट (14 पाठ्यक्रम - 6 क्रेडिट है।)

#### कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)

कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी) भी क्षमता वृद्धि पाठ्यक्रम है जो दैनिक जीवन के क्षेत्र में निर्धारित विशिष्ट कौशल का निर्माण करते हैं। इन्हें तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में प्रस्तावित किया गया है। प्रत्येक कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम

#### (विषय विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (डीएसई)

कार्यक्रम के पांचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर में विषय विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (डीएसई) प्रस्तुत किये जा रहे हैं। 4 डीएसई अध्ययन के विषय या विषय के लिए विशिष्ट (या विशेष या उन्नत या सहायक) हैं और एक विस्तृत दायरा प्रदान करते हैं। ये 6 क्रेडिट प्रत्येक (6 पाठ्यक्रमग 4 क्रेडिट) के हैं और इस प्रकार सभी में 24 क्रेडिट होंगे।

#### योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (ईसीसी)

योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (ईसीसी) चार-चार क्रेडिट के हैं। जैसा कि नाम से पता चलता है, सभी शिक्षार्थियों के लिए योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (ईसीसी) अनिवार्य है। दो ईसीसी पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन छात्रों को करना है। पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर में



एक-एक एईसीसी प्रस्तावित हैं। पहले दो सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक (2 पाठ्यक्रम - 4 क्रेडिट) में एक कोर्स के साथ, एईसीसी पाठ्यक्रम सभी में 8 क्रेडिट जोड़ देगा।

#### कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)

कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी) भी क्षमता वृद्धि पाठ्यक्रम है जो दैनिक जीवन के क्षेत्र में निर्धारित विशिष्ट कौशल का निर्माण करते हैं। इन्हें तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में प्रस्तावित किया गया है। प्रत्येक कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी) चार क्रेडिट का है।

#### सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई)

सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई) अन्य प्रकार के ऐच्छिक हैं जो कार्यक्रम के पहले, दूसरे, तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में उपलब्ध हैं। प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम में 6 क्रेडिट का कार्यभार है। ये पाठ्यक्रम प्रकृति में अंतर-अनुशासनात्मक हैं और रअन्य विषयों/विषयों के लिए एक जोखिम प्रदान करते हैं। पहले चार सेमेस्टर (4 पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट) में से प्रत्येक में एक कोर्स के साथ, जीई सभी में 24 क्रेडिट के लिए आएगा।

प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में, छात्रों को पाठ्यक्रमों की विभिन्न श्रेणियों से सभी पाठ्यक्रमों में चार पाठ्यक्रमों में चार पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन करना होता है, जबकि तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर को छोड़कर जब पाठ्यक्रमों की संख्या 5 हो जाती है। जब किसी सी., डीएसई और जीई श्रेणियों के अंतर्गत पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक में छह क्रेडिट के होते हैं एईसीसी और एसईसी के तहत पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक 4 क्रेडिट है। जबकि चौदह सीसी को 6 सेमेस्टर में वितरित किया जाता है, 4 डीएसई केवल पांचवे और छठे सेमेस्टर में उपलब्ध है। प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में सामान्य पूल में उपलब्ध कई एसईसी और जीई होंगे, जिनमें उन्हें पेशकश की जाती है। एक छात्र को. कार्यक्रम के तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर के दौरान प्रत्येक चार सेमेस्टर और एक एसईसी में अध्ययन के लिए केवल एक जीई का विकल्प चुनना होता है। समय-समय पर विश्वविद्यालय पाठ्यक्रमों के मौजूदा पूल में नए एसईसी और ऐच्छिक (डीएसई और जीई) जोड़ रहा है।

## 4.12 स्नातक उपाधि (ऑनर्स) संस्कृत (बी ए एस के एच)

### मानविकी विद्यापीठ (एसओएच)

विश्वविद्यालय अन्य विषयों के अतिरिक्त बी.ए. संस्कृत में ऑनर्स उपाधि कार्यक्रम प्रदान कर रहा है। कार्यक्रम से संबंधित जानकारी निम्नवत है—

#### उद्देश्य:

स्नातक उपाधि संस्कृत— बी.ए. संस्कृत ऑनर्स कार्यक्रम एक व्यापक कार्यक्रम है। इस कार्यक्रम का कोड BASKH है। यह कार्यक्रम संस्कृत विषय के गहन अध्ययन पर आधारित कार्यक्रम है जिसमें संस्कृत के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों का अध्ययन भी प्रस्तावित है। इस कार्यक्रम में विभिन्न विद्यापीठों से अध्ययन के कई विषय और पाठ्यक्रम शामिल हैं। एक एकल अनुशासन (संस्कृत) कुछ अंतर अनुशासनात्मक और कौशल आधारित वैकल्पिक पाठ्यक्रमों से तैयार किए गए पाठ्यक्रमों की पर्याप्त संख्या के साथ बी.ए. संस्कृत (ऑनर्स) को उस विशिष्ट अनुशासन संस्कृत में गहन ज्ञान प्रदान करने हेतु निर्मित किया है। बी.ए. संस्कृत (ऑनर्स) कार्यक्रम के सामान्य उद्देश्य निम्नरूपेण हैं —

- संस्कृत प्राचीनतम भाषा है, अतः संस्कृत व्याकरण संस्कृत वैदिक और लौकिक साहित्य में निहित ज्ञान परंपरा का परिचय, सम्प्रेषण और विस्तार करना।
- संस्कृत साहित्य के अध्ययन के माध्यम से भारतीय संस्कृति में निहित विविध ज्ञान परंपरा से छात्रों को परिचित करवाना
- मुख्य विषय, अनुशासन केंद्रित ऐच्छिक, कौशल वृद्धि तथा सामान्य पाठ्यक्रमों के माध्यम से संस्कृत के अनुशासन में मुख्य विषयों के अतिरिक्त संबंधित विषयों का शिक्षार्थियों को बोध करवाना।
- स्नातक स्तर पर सत्रीय कार्य और अभ्यास के माध्यम से शिक्षार्थियों को पढ़ने और लिखने के कौशल से परिचित कराना।
- शिक्षार्थियों को संस्कृत विषय के अतिरिक्त अन्य विषयों के अध्ययन की ओर प्रेरित करने हेतु विषयों को अंतःविषयी अध्ययन के लिए प्रेरित करना।

**पात्रता:** 10+2 किसी मान्यता प्राप्त संस्थान

**शिक्षा का माध्यम:** हिंदी

विश्वविद्यालय अपने सभी कार्यक्रमों के लिए क्रेडिट प्रणाली का अनुसरण करता है। 01 क्रेडिट शिक्षार्थी के अध्ययन के समय के 30 घंटे के बराबर है। 01 क्रेडिट में निर्धारित 30 घंटे का अभिप्राय केवल मात्र लिखित सामग्री का अध्ययन करना ही नहीं है अपितु इसमें दृश्य —श्रव्य सामग्री के अध्ययन में व्यतीत होने वाले घंटे टेलीकॉन्फ्रेंस, टेलीकन्फ्रेंस और असाइनमेंट में व्यतीत किया जाने वाला समय भी इसमें शामिल होगा उदाहरण के लिए ज्ञानवाणी, ज्ञानदर्शन, स्वयंप्रभा स्वयं, ज्ञानकोश इत्यादि में व्यतीत होने वाला समय भी इन घंटों में समाहित होगा। छात्रों को चार क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम के लिए 120 घंटे और 6 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम के लिए 180 घंटे अध्ययन की आवश्यकता है। एक अनुशासन में बी.ए. संस्कृत (ऑनर्स) की डिग्री प्राप्त करने के लिए

एक अधिगमकर्ता को 6 सेमेस्टर में (3 वर्ष में) 148 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रमों को पूरा करना होता है। छात्रों को पहले और दूसरे सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक में 22 क्रेडिट, तीसरे और चौथे प्रत्येक सेमेस्टर में 28 क्रेडिट तथा पाँचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर प्रत्येक में 24 क्रेडिट पूरे करने होंगे। ऑनर्स कार्यक्रमों में अंतर विषय पाठ्यक्रमों का मिश्रण होता है। 148 क्रेडिट अर्जित करने के लिए छात्र को निम्नलिखित श्रेणियों के पाठ्यक्रमों का अध्ययन करना होगा –

क) अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (सीसी)

ख) अनुशासन विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक (डीएसई)

ग) योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (ईसीसी)

घ) कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (एसईसी)

ड) सामान्य ऐच्छिक (जीई)

### अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (Core Courses CC)

कार्यक्रम में मुख्य पाठ्यक्रम अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम है। प्रत्येक अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट का है। अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रमों की इस श्रेणी में 14 पाठ्यक्रम हैं। यह अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम सम्पूर्ण कार्यक्रम के आधे से अधिक भाग को समेट लेते हैं संपूर्ण कार्यक्रम के 148 क्रेडिट में से 84 क्रेडिट  $14 \times 6 = 84$  क्रेडिट इनके लिए हैं।

### अनुशासन विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (Discipline Specific Electives DSE)

विषय विशिष्ट ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम कार्यक्रम के पांचवें और छठे सेमेस्टर में विषय विशेष शैक्षिक पाठ्यक्रम प्रस्तुत किए जा रहे हैं। यह पाठ्यक्रम प्रत्येक 6 क्रेडिट का है, दो पाठ्यक्रमों का पाँचवें सेमेस्टर में और दो पाठ्यक्रम का छठे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन करना है इस प्रकार यह 24 क्रेडिट के पाठ्यक्रम होंगे।

### कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम (Skill Enhancement Courses SEC)

कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम भी अधिगमकर्ताओं की क्षमताओं में वृद्धि हेतु प्रस्तुत किए हैं जो दैनिक जीवन में निर्धारित विशिष्ट कौशल में निपुण करते हैं कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम तीसरे और चौथे सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन का विषय रहेंगे कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम तृतीय सेमेस्टर में एक पाठ्यक्रम इसी प्रकार चतुर्थ सेमेस्टर में भी एक ही पाठ्यक्रम का अध्ययन करना होगा प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम 4 क्रेडिट का है इस प्रकार यह पाठ्यक्रम 8 क्रेडिट किए होंगे

### योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रम (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses AECC)

योग्यता संवर्धन अनिवार्य पाठ्यक्रमका शिक्षार्थियों को प्रथम और द्वितीय सेमेस्टर में अध्ययन करना होगा यह पाठ्यक्रम चार क्रेडिट का होगा इस प्रकार यह पाठ्यक्रम 8 क्रेडिट के होंगे जैसा कि नाम से ही स्पष्ट है कि शिक्षार्थियों की योग्यता संवर्धन हेतु इन पाठ्यक्रमों को प्रस्तुत कार्यक्रम में स्थान दिया गया है

### सामान्य ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम (Generic Electives GE)

सामान्य ऐच्छिक अन्य प्रकार के ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम है जो प्रथम द्वितीय तृतीय और चतुर्थ सेमेस्टर में अधिगमकर्ताओं के लिए उपलब्ध होंगे। प्रत्येक पाठ्यक्रम 6 क्रेडिट का होगा। इन पाठ्यक्रमों की प्रकृति अंतर अनुशासनात्मक हैं और अन्य विषय के लिए उपलब्ध होंगे अर्थात् बी. ए. संस्कृत ऑनर्स के शिक्षार्थियों से इतर विषयों के शिक्षार्थियों के लिए यह सामान्य ऐच्छिक पाठ्यक्रम प्रस्तावित है

**Objectives (BAUDH):** Objectives: With a substantial number of Core courses and a few interdisciplinary and skill-based elective courses, the Bachelor Honours Programme in Urdu is designed to give an in-depth knowledge in Urdu discipline while allowing for exposure to subject beyond the discipline. The Bachelor Honours Programme in Urdu has the following objectives:

1. Introduce the learners to the main themes and topics in a discipline of Urdu with core and elective courses.
2. Enable the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses.
3. Introduce the learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises of such kind at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary by enabling them to offer courses outside their discipline.

## 4.14 Bachelor of Performing Arts – Hindustani Music (Honours)(BAPFHMH) School of Performing and Visual Arts (SOPVA)

B.A. (Performing Arts) – Hindustani Music Hons. (BAPFHMH) programme in Open & Distance Learning mode is an opportunity to large segment of the population including the disadvantaged to pursue a programme in Hindustani classical Music. The programme aims to provide Classical music education to the discerning students who do not have access to study it through conventional system. This course has been designed for serious students of music to get knowledge of the subject theoretically as well as practically. The programme objectives are to provide learners with learning experiences that help instill deep interests in learning Hindustani Classical music prevalent in the major part of Indian continent and develop broad and balanced knowledge and understanding of core components like: musical elements, principles, history of music, contributions of various musicologists throughout the ages, music education, and Aesthetics theories related to Hindustani Classical Music. The programme will also provide opportunities to the students to collaborate with fellow students and put up a joint stage production which will be a unique experience for the students of Performing Arts.

**Objectives:** The B.A. (Performing Arts) – Hindustani Music Hons.) Is designed to give an in-depth knowledge in

the discipline of Hindustani Classical Music while allowing for exposure to subjects beyond the discipline as well. The programme is appropriate for ODL as it focuses on the skill and competence development having both professional and academic proficiency leading to job opportunities and over all development. The Honours programme has the following general objectives:

1. To introduce the learner to main themes and topics in the discipline of Hindustani Classical Music through core & discipline-centric electives, ability / skill enhancement and generic courses.
2. To facilitate the learners to work towards ability and skill enhancement through exposure to appropriate courses in humanities and social sciences.
3. Introduce learners to reading and writing skills through assignments and exercises at an undergraduate level.
4. Expose the learners to the importance of interdisciplinary study by enabling them to take courses outside their disciplines.

**Learning Outcomes:** By undergoing this programme, the learner will: -

- Earn the proficiency to sing the prescribed Ragas with correct voice production.
- Be able to demonstrate the prescribed Talas.
- Be capable to express their understanding of evolution of Indian Classical Music
- Be able to understand and elaborate the historical development of Hindustani Music.
- Gain knowledge about the treatises of music written through the ages.
- Earn proficiency to collaborate with fellow artists to put up a group stage show.
- Develop pedagogical understanding of the subject to get employed in teaching jobs

**Eligibility:** 10+2

**Desirable:** Studied music as one of the subject in 11th and 12th Class / who have learned music from an institution or a guru.

**Medium of Instruction:** Hindi

(Although the SLM will be given in Hindi students will be allowed to write their assignments and exams in English too.)

The Honours programmes have a mix of courses. For earning 148 credits, a student has to study the following categories of courses:

- a) Core Courses (CC)
- b) Discipline Specific Electives (DSE)
- c) Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)
- d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)
- e) Generic Electives (GE)

#### **Core Courses (CC)**

The programme has 14 core courses. Each core course is of six credits. These courses cover more than half of the programme, 84 credits (14 courses x 6 credits) out of 148 credits of the programme.

#### **Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)**

Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSEs) are on offer in the fifth and sixth semesters of the programme. The 4 DSEs are specific(or specialized or advanced or supportive)to the discipline or subject of study and provide an extended scope. They are of 6 credits each (6 courses x 4 credits) and will thus be 24 credits in all.

#### **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)**

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses are of four credits each. As the name suggests, the Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECCs) are compulsory for all learners. There are two AECCs on offer, one each in the first and second semesters.the AECC courses will add upto 8 credits in all.

#### **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are also ability enhancement courses. These are value-based and/or skill based courses and are designed to develop competencies and skills. Each Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) is of four credits. These courses are on offer in the third and fourth semesters. One SEC in each semester (2 courses x 4 credits) will add up to 8credits.

### Generic Electives (GE)

Generic Electives (GEs) are the other type of electives that are on offer in the first, second, third and fourth semesters of the programme and are of 6 credits each. These courses are inter-disciplinary in nature and provide an exposure to other disciplines/ subjects. With one course in each of the first four semesters, (4 courses x 6 credits), GE will come to 24 credits in all.

### SEMESTER WISE COURSES

In each semester, the students have to study four 4 courses in all from different categories of courses except in the third and fourth semesters when the number of courses goes up to 5. While the courses under CC, DSE and GE Categories are of 6 credits each, the courses under AECC and SEC are of 4 credits each. While the fourteen CCs are distributed across the six semesters, the four DSEs are available in the fifth and sixth semesters only. There will be a number of SECs and the GEs available in the common pool in each of the semesters in which they are offered. A student has to opt for only one GE for study in each of the first four semesters and one SEC during the third and fourth semesters of the programme. The university will be adding new SECs and electives (DSEs and GEs) to the existing pool of courses from time to time. The study load in the first and second semesters will be 22 credits each and while the credit load in the third and fourth semesters will be enhanced to 28 credits each, it will come down to 24 credits each in the fifth and sixth semesters. Thus the total study load will come to 148 credits. MSW(C) Programme would be offered initially through one or two Learner Support Centres under each Regional Centre. The programme can be taken only through activated Learner Support Centres or special Learner Support Centres through each Regional Centre. This Programme is offered both in English and Hindi. For Field Work in the MSW (Counselling) programme much focus is given on specialization in Counselling and 40 percent weightage is given for the practicum.

## 5.37 Master of Arts (Folklore and Culture Studies) (MAFCS)

### School of Interdisciplinary and Trans-disciplinary Studies (SOITS)

Folklore is one of the upcoming areas of research and pedagogy. The modular MAFCS Programme (the first year programme being PGDFCS: 32 credits) aims at creating a pool of specialized folklorists who can create a niche for themselves in fields of study like teaching and research departments in colleges and universities, libraries, museums, archives, historical associations, culture councils, national centres of arts, publishing houses, funding agencies, and the central and state government institutions, Agriculture, Rural Sociology, Extension, Medicine and Nursing, Women's Studies, African American Studies, Popular Culture, English and Foreign Language/Literature Departments as translators, interpreters, curators, musicologists, teachers, artists, performers, and many more. Film industry and TV channels also have a high demand for folklorists. Folk Entrepreneurs are coming up in a big way as job creators/providers, and this programme aims at creating self-reliant scholars of folklore.

A significant trend that emerges from the review of folklore is that in any period of human history, knowledge about theory, data and method is insured by the socio-cultural conditions specific to that period. India is a country with incredible cultural diversity. Each culture has its own traditional knowledge system. We are right when we say that people in the new- millennial , the denizens of the digital societies have a notoriously short-span attention and memory, and folk traditions are a part of endangered and dying cultures. Given such a situation, folklorists and folklore researchers are vulnerable to multiple challenges with regard to archiving, documentation and dissemination of the folk material. MAFCS sincerely aims at filling that gap and is dedicated towards the preservation of a dying/endangered traditional knowledge system. India's National Education Policy (NEP) and the University Grants Commission (UGC) pay a lot of importance to culture, languages and folklore and MAFCS maintains a balance with the points accentuated by the NEP and UGC.

MAFCS argues that all our classical art and literary forms have a folk background. Starting from our universities' syllabi to our coffee tables, classical literature always asserts its position, though we have failed to pay the due credit to folk literature. A literature, the product of and is a representation of mass culture, is definitely authentic and full fledged. Since there is this aspect of faithful representation of the ways of life of communities at the core of folk literature, MAFCS considers folk literature as autonomous. Folk is not something out there in a museum, it is a part and parcel of our lives, and thus, is fit enough to be our mainstream research. The modern texts that have made explicit use of the folk traditions to make it available to the readers today are also treated at par with the folk texts that have only the oral tradition, called the 'pure folk'. MAFCS experiments with that idea. The key idea of the MAFCS Programme is—folklore is flexible.

#### PROGRAMME PACKAGE

The programme has a blended approach. The package consists of self-instructional material in the form of booklets/blocks and audio video materials. Globally it is projected that two-third of mankind will live in the urban areas by 2025. India is 2nd largest urban system in the world with more than 30 percent of urban population. It is expected that by 2025, half of the India's population will be urbane. ## 5.44 Master of Arts (Women and Gender Studies) (MAWGS)

### School of Gender & Development Studies (SOGDS)

Women's & Gender Studies are emerging and growing areas of academic inquiry today. The modular MAWGS programme is aimed at students with a Bachelor's degree in any discipline with an interest in this area. The programme will acquaint students with the academic area of women's and gender studies and its history, theoretical premises and progression to present day status. It is expected that learners who have completed the MA programme would have a deeper understanding of formulations of empowerment. They would have been exposed to cultural, literary, political and socioeconomic dimensions within gender frameworks through either one of the two specialisations. This degree will equip students with the ability to deconstruct the complex power hierarchies and relationships operating in society, from the perspective of women and gender.

#### Career Options

Students completing the Master's Degree will be able to pursue higher studies and research programmes, find employment with government agencies, corporate sector, advocacy assignments through national and international

non-profit organisations, pursue careers in teaching, writing, editing, mass media or opt for other appropriate career options.

### Modular Structure and Specializations

This is a 66 credit two year programme. The first year consists of core, foundational courses which will equip learners with an analytical and critical understanding of theoretical and conceptual issues related to women's and gender studies in an inter-disciplinary context. Due to the progressive nature of the programme, students are required to complete the core foundation courses to be offered sequentially in semester 1 and semester 2 before proceeding further. Learners who successfully complete the requirements of the 34 credit first year curriculum (32 credits of coursework + 2 credits for Project Work) may exit with P.G.Diploma in Women's & Gender Studies. Thus, learners may exit at this point or continue for the 2nd year to earn the MA degree in Women's & Gender Studies.

After completion of the first year curriculum, learners may choose one of two specializations namely, "Gender, Literature & Culture" or "Women's Studies". The courses offered in the third and fourth semesters are specific to the individual specializations. The specialization in "Gender, Literature and Culture" enables students to familiarize themselves with salient topics in the humanities from the perspective of gender. Courses in third and fourth semesters enhance their critical understanding of important issues such as marginalized cultural spaces, relationship between gender and the nation, gender and discourse (especially literary), and the mutually constructive relationships between literature, culture and society. The specialization in "Women's Studies" exposes students to multidisciplinary approaches of addressing historical and contemporary women's issues. It equips the students in conceptualizing and developing analytical skills required to understand women's issues through theory, praxis, research and practicum.

## 5.45 Master of Arts (Gender and Development Studies) (MAGD)

### School of Gender & Development Studies (SOGDS)

The programme is likely to be of interest to academics and researchers; trainers, facilitators, supervisors; staff of organizations working in the area of gender and development; government personnel; personnel working in banks and financial institutions.

Development policies and practices have a differential impact on women and men. This necessitates an understanding of the "gender gap" in access to resources, privileges, entitlements and choices. Consensus has evolved around the need to explore the "gender gap" in key development sectors and how this gap can be bridged. There is now greater emphasis on mainstreaming gender perspectives into the development process. This will contribute to building a gender-sensitive rubric of development, recasting development theory and action in the "direction of improved living standards, socially responsible management and use of resources, elimination of gender subordination and socio economic inequality as well as to promote the organizational restructuring required to bring about desirable change."

Exploration of gender issues has become an important activity for most non-governmental organizations. Increasing emphasis is being laid in Governmental agencies on establishing gender-differential impacts and taking positive, affirmative action towards gender equality and equity. It is now widely acknowledged that gender considerations need to be reflected in all development plans, programmes and policies. There is growing concern over the isolation of women in so-called "soft" sectors in education, employment and development rather than mainstreaming gender concerns across all organizations, institutions and activities. While the concerns are clearly articulated, national goals and the UN millennium/sustainable development goals cannot be achieved without concrete effort towards gender equality.

Achieving gender equality and gender equity requires multi-pronged approaches and strategies. One of the key approaches and strategies revolves around design and development of suitable educational programmes that equip practitioners and policy makers with the requisite knowledge and skills to make a valuable contribution in this sphere. The Master's/ Postgraduate Diploma programmes would make an excellent foundation for analyzing, critically assessing existing development interventions and promoting gender-sensitive/gender-based research and action. The strong focus envisaged on positive affirmative action would be of considerable significance.

## 5.47 Master of Science (Mathematics with Application in Computer Science) (MSCMACS)

These core courses which you will be studying during the first two semesters of your studies, will prepare you well to study the courses offered during the third and the fourth semesters.

#### Elective Courses

The elective courses will expose you to the applications of mathematics in the area of computer sciences.

#### Project

Project work is compulsory. It aims to provide hands on work experience in some Industry/ Organizations/R&D establishment/Institution. The project guide will give you all the details related to the project work.

#### Practical

Most of the courses of the programme have computer practical component. Practicals session will be held at the programme centres. Attending and completing the practical sessions is compulsory for each student. The total number of practical sessions per semester ranges from 11 to 36. The sessions are spread over the entire semester. In order to be eligible for attending the Term-end-Examination of the practicals in a course, the student has to complete **at least** 70% of the practical sessions prescribed for the course.

#### Scheme of Study

In order to enable the learners to complete your M.Sc (MACS) programme within the minimum period of two years, you will have to take 16 credits worth of courses in each of the four semesters. Registration to the programme is semester-wise. ## 6.3 Post Graduate Diploma in Early Childhood and Foundational Stage Education (PGDECFE)

### School of Continuing Education (SOCE)

Globally, it has been recognized that the period of early childhood comprises the period from birth to 8 years. There is developmental continuity in the period of birth to eight years and it is important to respond comprehensively to the child's health, nutrition, stimulation and learning needs simultaneously. Also in terms of pedagogical principles underlying planning and transacting learning experiences, there needs to be a continuity in terms of adopting the play based and activity based approaches of the preschool years into the early primary grades, specifically classes 1 and 2. The NEP, 2020, has given explicit recognition to the period of birth to eight years as the period for Early Childhood Care and Education and has called this period as the 'Foundation of Learning'. Structurally the NEP has clubbed the period from 3 to 8 years as the Foundational Stage of Education.

#### Objectives:

- To provide learning experiences that will prepare the students for effective participation in varied contexts such as crèches, preschools, and early primary classes.
- To provide opportunities to functionaries and teachers working in the sector to critically examine their practice and enhance it, by exposing them to the developmental and pedagogical basis of designing early development, learning and educational experiences.

Practicing teachers/ professionals in the sector, supervisors, curriculum developers, and those aspiring to be teacher educators for Early Childhood Care and Education and Early Primary Classes (Grades 1 and 2) will find the programme useful.

#### Programme Details:

This 40 credits programme comprises 8 courses of which 5 are theory courses with compulsory assignments, 1 field-based practical course and 2 internship courses. One internship has to be carried out in a pre-primary section / preschool and the second internship in classes 1 or Class2. The sites for internships will need to be identified by the student on their own, according to stated guidelines.

The student can appear for the examinations of the theory papers for the first time in December 2023. The Internship 1 can be carried out after student studies Courses 1, 2 and 4; and Internship 2 after studying Courses 1, 3 and 4.

At a later stage, the students who complete the PG Diploma can enroll for the Master's Programme in Early Childhood Care and Education, when the same is launched in the near future.

The social relevance of the Programme may be categorized as:

- In a vast and diverse country like India, it is important that policy planners are sensitive to the impact of the developmental processes on the marginalized communities. This programme can contribute to that since it has two major concerns, first, to study the marginal society in their specificity, second, the impact of the contact with more complex societies on the marginal communities as tribes.
- This Programme seeks to address to that section of students who are not covered by formal education, mainly those students who seek to join the NGO circles or intend to pursue higher education in trans-disciplinary subjects such as Ethnography, Migration Studies, Marginal Studies, etc.
- It has the objective of appreciating culture and folklore in all their composite forms and of evaluating the social and political context in which culture manifests itself. It has the object of study and the location of political criticism by its focal points such as Marginal Studies, Tribal and Folklore Literature, Language Death and Preservation, etc.
- It has an obligation to an ethical appraisal of traditional as well as the modern society.

## 8.15 Post Graduate Certificate in Medical Management of CBRNE Disasters (PGCMDM)

### School of Health Sciences (SOHS)

The term CBRNE stands for 'Chemical Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and Explosive'. Disasters related to such agents can occur accidentally. However, when used intentionally they become agents of mass destruction. CBRNE disasters are ill-understood, diagnosis is difficult and very little management tools exist to manage these disasters, including medical management. Medical management of CBRNE disasters require specific knowledge and skill set that is not covered in the undergraduate curriculum. India is particularly vulnerable to CBRNE attacks. Thus, society and governments need to create special provisions to deal with them. In light of the above facts, IGNOU in collaboration with Institute of Nuclear Medicine and Allied Sciences (INMAS), Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) and active support from Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) and Defence Research and Development Establishment (DRDE) have developed a 6 months PG Certificate programme in Medical Management of CBRNE disasters through open and distance learning for MBBS doctors. This programme is considered as a Continuing Medical Education programme by Medical Council of India

#### PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES

After completing the programme, the learner should be able to:

- comprehend the parameters, enormity and complexity of CBRNE threat from a medical perspective
- describe the impact of chemical, radiological, biological, explosive and nuclear agents on human health
- assess the health effects of a CBRNE scenario using external and internal assessment tools
- discuss regarding the medical counter measures, detection equipments and SOPs of medical management of CBRNE impacts.
- deliver first aid and initiate immediate life saving responses to a CBRNE disaster
- develop competencies on protection, mitigation and medical management of CBRNE casualties
- get sensitized about the current R&D initiatives and future directions.

#### Target Group

- Medical personnel & students engaged in or interested in disaster medical management Doctors in armed forces, police forces, health services, railways, airports/ports, & NDRF or State disaster forces who have to or can be called on to respond in face of CBRNE disasters.
- Doctors working in or for organizations considered vulnerable to CBRN attacks or accidents such as industrial complexes, Shrines, melas, areas prone to terror attacks, border towns etc.
- Faculty in all large and medium-large hospitals (public & corporatesector)
- Medical Management staff of all referral hospitals
- Retired doctors who want to contribute to the Nation's strength & medical security in CBRN.

### Selection Criteria

Selection will be made on the basis of Regional Centre/LSC. In each Learner Support Centre (LSC), a maximum of 30 students will be admitted. Applicants will be required to fill three choices of LSCs. The allotment of the LSC will be done to eligible applicants as per merit according to their choice and availability of the seats in the centres following IGNOU's reservation policy. If eligible applicants cannot be accommodated in their opted LSCs but seats remain vacant in the LSCs not opted by them, they could be offered admission in the vacant seats.

The scores for merit will be calculated by considering two criteria:

- Total percentage of marks secured in all MBBS examinations.

They evaluate the existing laws, newly amended and enacted laws in the context of gender to ensure justice and equality for all genders.

This programme will investigate the various aspects of gender and law in the Indian context by engaging with the foundations of core themes such as understanding the Indian legal system; differences between sex and gender; multiple sexualities; patriarchy in law; heteronormativity in law; equality and discrimination in law; gender-based violence (domestic, sexual, communal, caste, conflict, violence against LGBTI) and so on. It will also enhance our understanding on gender and governance.

These crops further contain residues of the poisonous chemicals that disrupt the health of human. Now emphasis is being laid on organic agriculture which primarily depends on the On-farm resources and maintains the farm biodiversity for sustaining the production in long run without use of chemicals.

With the increase in geriatric population as well as social limitations such as nuclear families, there is greater evidence of requirement of Geriatric Care Assistants. The CGCA program is thus a platform for gaining knowledge, to understand the activities and variety of care interventions that are required by an elderly patient. There will be around 6 weeks hands on skill training in the hospital / medical college.

Change in land ownership and gender-sensitive labour laws facilitated women to be involved in decision-making and reduced drudgery. But Indian agriculture has not yet addressed many issues confronted by women in agriculture. Feminization of agriculture, gender biases in agriculture and rural development are the global issues of concern. Women often lose control over resources such as land and are generally excluded from access to improved agricultural methods. Women and men are affected differently by economic change and development, and thus an active public policy is needed to intervene to close gender gaps. In this context, agriculture needs to look towards sustainability in its planning and policy process and the women's contribution to sustainable agricultural development. Changing the policy makers' mindset, government functionaries, extension workers, researchers, and students is a need of an hour. This ODL programme on 'Gender, Agriculture and Sustainable Development' will address above mentioned issues to create awareness among all stakeholders.

## 12 UNIVERSITY RULES

The University reserves the right to change the rules from time to time. However, latest rules will be applicable to all the students irrespective of the year of the registration.

### 12.1 Educational Qualifications Awarded By Private Institutions

Any educational qualification awarded by the Private Universities established under the provisions of the "**Chhattisgarh NijiKshetra Vishwavidyalaya (Sthapana Aur Viniyaman), Adhiniyam, 2002**" are non-existent and cannot be considered for admission to any Academic Programme in IGNOU.

### 12.2 Validity of Degree for Admission

Master's Degree awarded without a first degree of three year duration is not recognised for purposes of admission to IGNOU's Academic Programmes. However, this condition is not applicable for the five- year Integrated Master's degree acquired from a recognized University/Institution.

Bachelor's Degree means, **Bachelor's Degree of not less than three year duration.**

### 12.3 Acceptance of 'Two year Bachelor's degree'

Students who had enrolled themselves in the first degree course prior to June 4, 1986 and students who had successfully completed their first degree course, prior to June 4, 1986, irrespective of their duration shall be treated at par with the students who have completed Three years degree and they are not required to undergo a further one year bridge course. Degrees obtained prior to June 4, 1986 and the degree awarded to the students enrolled upto June 1986, but completed subsequently shall be treated valid for all purposes including admission to a Masters degree programme and other higher studies.

IGNOU accepts First degree of Two year duration obtained from a recognized university **completed up to the year 1998-99** for purposes of higher studies; **provided such students have undergone a further one year bridge course and passed the same to be in conformity with UGC Regulations.**

#### Degrees acquired from an 'Off Campus' Centre

Degrees acquired from an '**Off Campus' Centre of Private Universities** outside the territorial jurisdiction of the State concerned are **not** recognized for purposes of admission to IGNOU's academic programmes unless it has specific approval of the University Grants Commission.

Similarly, Degrees acquired through an 'Off Campus' Centre/ 'Off-shore' Campus of Central/State/ Deemed to be Universities/Institutions of National Importance offered through Open and Distance learning (ODL) mode will be accepted for purposes of higher studies in IGNOU; provided these have been obtained as per territorial jurisdiction of these Central/State/Deemed to be Universities/Institutions of National Importance prescribed by the University Grants Commission from time to time.

### 12.4 Validity of Admission (Merit Based/Entrance Test Based)

Learners offered admission have to join on or before the due dates specified by the University. In case they want to seek admission for the next session, they will have to apply afresh and go through the admission process again.

### 12.5 Simultaneous Registration

As per the University policy, a student is allowed to pursue two academic programmes simultaneously through ODL / Online mode, as per the illustration given below.

"Re-registration" means registration in the next semester/year of a programme, wherever applicable. Learners are advised to submit the Re-Registration (RR) forms 'Online' on the web portal [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in). as

per schedule being notified by the University from time to time, irrespective of the fact that whether the learners appeared in the examination or not or whether they are passed or not in the course(s) registered in the current academic session. If the Re-Registration in any of the programme is not available online or for any other reason as specified by the University, Learners should submit their RR forms at the respective Regional Centre ONLY and nowhere else. If any student submits the 'Offline' Re-Registration Form at any other Regional Centre than the allocated Regional Centre, and consequently misses the scheduled date and a semester/ year, he/she will have no claim on the University for regularization. International students of the University pursuing their programme from India are also advised to submit re-registrations form online. Offline forms, if any, may be submitted to the International Division of the University.

## 12.7 Additional time for Learners with Disability

- Learners with disability of 40% or more are given additional 2 (two) years beyond the maximum duration prescribed for all academic programmes.
- Learners with disability seeking benefit of the aforesaid facility should submit the 'Disability Certificate' issued by the competent authority at the Regional Centre concerned, which, in turn will verify it, make entry in the data base and transmit the data to SRD for updating in the Master records.

## 12.8 Reservation for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, non- creamy layer of OBC, Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) for admission in Central Educational Institutions

The University provides reservation of seats for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, non- creamy layer of OBC, Economically Weaker Sections, (as notified by MHRD vide OM 12-4/019-U1 dated January 2019), War Widows, Kashmiri Migrants and Physically Handicapped learners, as per the Government of India rules, for admission to its programmes in which there are limited number of seats and admission is through a merit list. However, submission of forged certificate under any category shall make the student liable not only for cancellation of admission but also legal action as per Government of India rules.

Ministry of Human Resource Development, Department of Higher Education, Govt. of India, vide their Office Memorandum F.No. 12-4/2019-UI, dated 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2019, on the subject cited above, has conveyed that in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution (One Hundred and Third Amendment) Act 2019, and in reference of Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment vide OM No. 20013/01/2018-BC-II dated 17th January, 2019, enabling provision of reservation for the Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and the Socially and Educationally backward Classes, it has been decided to provide reservation in admission to educational Institutions subject to a maximum of ten per cent of the total seats in each category. The provision of reservations to the Economically Weaker Sections shall be in accordance with the directions contained in the OM No. 20013/01/2018-8C-11 dated 17th January, 2019 of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment subject to the condition mentioned in the Office Memorandum of MHRD.

Accordingly, the reservations shall be provided to EWSs for admission in the University from the academic year 2019-20 onwards beginning academic session July 2019. The reservation shall be applicable only in Programmes having seat restriction.

## 12.9 Scholarships

The learners enrolled in IGNOU are eligible for Government of India Scholarships. They are advised visit the National Scholarship Portal of the Government of India <https://scholarships.gov.in/> and submit their application online. For further details students may contact. At the headquarters, Student Service Centre can be contacted for details.

Students belonging to the Scheduled Caste category may apply for financial assistance under the Centrally Sponsored Scheme of Post Matric Scholarship. ## 12.10 Scheme of Fee Support to SC/ST Students

The University provides exemption of programme fee to students from SC/ST category as per its policy. The policy is reviewed for every admission cycle. Students are advised to visit the University website or contact the Regional Centre to know about the latest provisions. The exemption, if admissible, will be allowed for one programme only.

The following SC and ST students are **not** eligible for fee exemption:

- ☐ who are employed OR
- ☐ who are availing any kind of fellowship or fee exemption from other agencies, OR
- ☐ whose Parents'/ Guardians' income from all Sources exceeds Rs 2.5 lakhs during financial year as per Government of India norms.

The applicants should submit income certificate issued by Authorized Government Agency while taking admission. The exemption of fee is confined to the extent of Programme Fee mentioned in the Prospectus. The students belonging to these categories will have to pay late fee (if any), Term End Examination Fee, convocation fee, Registration fee, etc. since these are not exempted under this Scheme.

## 12.11 Registration fee, Cancellation of Admission and Refund of Fee paid for Re-Registration to a programme will not be refunded in any case.

A non-refundable Registration Fee of as prescribed time to time (unless specified otherwise) shall be charged along with the programme fee of first semester/year at the time of admission.

If a student applies for cancellation of admission and refund of fee, the refund request will be considered as per the University policy available on website: [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)

**Notes:**

- 1) While counting the period, the date on which request for cancellation of admission is received from the candidate, shall be taken into account.
- 2) The date on which admission is confirmed, shall be excluded while counting the period.
- 3) The refund will be reverted to the same Debit/Credit Card/ Net Banking Account from where the payment has been received. However, where the validity of the Debit/Credit Card expires in between, and the bank accepts the refund in spite of expiry of validity of the card, the user will be responsible for getting the money of refunded from such bank. In cases where the refund is not accepted by the bank under the said Debit/ Credit Card account, or the closure of the payment gateway through which the payment was initially received, the refund of fee will be made through NEFT after obtaining the account details from the student. In cases of (a) to (c) above, the candidate will make a written/email request to the Registrar, SRD for such a refund.

### 12.12 Waiver of IGNOU Programme fee for Jail Inmates

Inmates lodged in Prisons in the country are exempted from payment of programme fee, including registration fee. The under-trial/short term prisoners are also eligible for the same benefit of exemption as is extended to other prisoners with the condition that when they go out of jail, they will be treated as normal students and shall pay subsequent fees wherever applicable (examination fee, re-registration fee, registration fee for convocation etc.).

### 12.13 Digital Study Material and Assignments

The University has a provision to provide soft copy of the self-learning material in place of printed material. A learner opting for the **soft copy will be given a discount of 15% in the Programme Fee**. The Option to this effect has to be indicated by the learners while filling in the Online Admission Form. Such learners will not be given printed self-learning material. The University has digitized the study material for different programmes. The digitized material is available on eGyankosh, the digital repository of the University.

The University encourages the use of digital study material. It has been decided that as an incentive **15% concession shall be given to the students who opt for digital study material in place of printed study material**.

The University sends study material to all the students and if a student does not receive the same for any reason; whatsoever, the University shall not be held responsible for that.

Assignments for the current session are made available on the website. Students are advised to download the same.

For non-receipt of study material, learners are required to write to the Registrar, Material Production and Distribution Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi – 110 068.

### 12.14 Change of Elective/Course

Change in Elective/Course is permitted within 30 days from the receipt of first set of course material on payment of **Rs.350/- for a 2/4 credit course or part thereof, and Rs.700/- for a 6/8 credit course for undergraduate courses. For Master's Degree Programme, it is Rs.600/- for 2/4 credits and Rs.1200/- for 6/8 credits course**. Payment should be made by way of a Demand Draft drawn in favour of "IGNOU" payable at the place of concerned Regional Centre. All such requests for change of Elective/ Course should be addressed to the concerned Regional Centre only as per schedule.

### 12.15 Change of Medium

For CBCS Based Bachelor's Degree Programme, Change of medium will be allowed as per on payment of applicable fee.

For other Programmes Change of Medium is permitted within 30 days from the receipt of first set of course material **in the first year ONLY, on payment of Rs.350/- plus Rs.350/- per 2/4 credit course and Rs.700/- per 6/8 credit course for undergraduate courses. For Master's Degree Programme it is Rs.350/- plus Rs.600/- per 2/4 credit course and Rs.1200/- per 6/8 credit course**. Payment should be made by way of a Demand Draft drawn in favour of "IGNOU" payable at the place of concerned Regional Centre. All such requests for change of Medium should be addressed to the **concerned Regional Centre only**, as perschedule.

## 12.16 Change of Programme

Change of Programme is **NOT permitted** in CBCS-Based BA To BAG, BCOM To BCOMG and BSC To BSCG Programmes.

For other Programmes Change of programme in Master's Degree (MEG/MHD/MPS/MAH/MPA/MSO/MEC/MARD/M.Com./ MAPY/MAPC) is permitted only in the first year of study within 30 days from the last date of applying for admissions. A student has to pay the full fee for the new Programme and he/she has to forgo the fee paid for the earlier programme.

The request for change of programme should be addressed to the Regional Director of concerned Regional Centre. Payment should be made by way of a Demand Draft drawn in favour of "IGNOU" and Online Payment of Miscellaneous Fees (SBI Collect) through IGNOU website: [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)

## 12.17 Credit Transfer

Credit transfer means allowing a student of another university to get admitted to IGNOU for completing any equivalent degree/diploma programme on the basis of credits obtained by him/her from that University. A student thus admitted need not write IGNOU examinations for such courses which are found equivalent to and for which appropriate credits would be deemed to have been acquired for, and for purposes of fulfilling the IGNOU requirements for award of a degree/diploma.

Students who want to avail of credit transfer shall get registered with IGNOU for the programmes they want to study. All the applications for this purpose should be addressed to The Registrar, Student Registration Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi-110068.

The facility of credit transfer under Academic Bank of Credits envisioned in the National Education Policy 2020 is also available.

## 12.18 Counselling and Examination Centre

All Learner Support Centres, Programme Learner Support Centres, special Learner Support Centres are not Examination centres. Practical Examination need not necessarily be held at the centre where the learner has undergone counselling or practicals.

## 12.19 Correction of Address and Learner Support Centre Change

Students can initiate the request for change of address, Learner Support Centre and regional centre online from their user account. The user account is to be created at <https://ignou.samarth.edu.in> by clicking 'New Registration'.

## 12.20 Change of Regional Centre

When a learner wants transfer from one region to another, he/she has to write to that effect to the Regional Centre from where he/she is seeking a transfer marking copies to the Regional Centre where he/she would like to be transferred to. Further, he/she has to obtain a certificate from the Coordinator of the Learner Support Centre from where he/she is seeking transfer regarding the number of assignments submitted. The Regional Director from where the learner is seeking the transfer will transfer all records including details of fee payment to the new Regional Centre under intimation to the Registrar, Student Registration Division (SRD) and the learner as well. For change of Region in practical oriented Programmes like computer programmes, B.Sc. etc., 'No Objection Certificate' is to be obtained from the concerned Regional Centre/Learner Support Centre where the learner wishes his/her transfer.

In case any learner is keen for transfer from Army/Navy/ Air Force Regional Centre to any other Regional Centre of the University during the cycle/session, he/she would have to pay the fee-share money to the Regional Centre. In case the learner seeks transfer at the beginning of the session/cycle, the required programme course fee for the session/cycle shall be deposited at the Regional Centre. However, the transfer shall be subject to availability of seats wherever applicable.

The learner can seek transfer to any other overseas Learner Support Centre only after six months of



Registration or submission of first year/semester assignments for the programme of one year or longer duration.

### 12.21 Eligibility for Term End Examinations

The learners are instructed to **refer to Page No. 19, para 1.17** Evaluation System sub-head '**Term-end Examination and Payment of Examination Fee**' before submitting Examination Form for appearing in the June as well as December Term-end examination. A learner having exhausted the maximum duration of a programme should not apply for appearing at the Term-end examination of any course without getting re-registered/sought readmission for the same. Otherwise, the result would be withheld in such cases.

The students seeking admission to CBCS based Bachelor Degree Programme in July 2019 admission session will be allowed to appear for the term end examinations for all the courses of first and second semesters together in June 2020 TEE only. Subsequently, as per the existing practices they will be allowed to appear in both December and June term end exam to complete their courses. Students can appear for the TEE for only those courses for which the student has opted and has submitted the assignment within the stipulated period.

### 12.22 Foreign Students

Foreign students residing in India having valid student visa for the minimum duration of the programme are eligible to seek admission in IGNOU's selected programmes on payment of international fee applicable for them. For programme fee and other charges the student can visit "INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS" icon on IGNOU's website or contact the Director, International Division, IGNOU, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi 110 068. Admission of foreign student residing in India will be processed by the International Division of the University after ensuring their antecedents from the Ministry of External Affairs/ Ministry of Human Resource Development. Programmes with limited number of seats are not offered to foreign students.

In case of any query / information, FSRI and overseas students are advised to refer international prospectus available on the website of the university.

### 12.23 Guidelines for Admission in respect of International Students residing in India

- a) Download the Admission form for the respective Programme from IGNOU's website [www.ignou.ac.in](http://www.ignou.ac.in)
- a. Fill up all the columns of the Admission forms and attach the relevant documents (as mentioned in the Prospectus) along with fee and cost of registration fee.
- b. Submit the hard copy of the form along with documents and fees at the following address Director, International Division, IGNOU, Block No. 15, Section K, Maidan Garhi, New Delhi.
- c. The learner must fill all the Columns of the Admission Form, failing which the admission form will not be processed for admission. The complete applications should reach at the above address not later than the last date of submission of forms.
- b) The learner may apply only for those courses for which International fees have been prescribed.
- a. The learner will have to produce the valid STUDY VISA for the minimum duration of the programme. Presently, the students from Nepal and Bhutan are not required to submit the Study Visa.
- b. The learner will have to remit the International Fees of Programme.
- c) The fee has to be remitted through Bank Draft favouring "IGNOU" payable at "New Delhi".
- a. The learner should possess the minimum qualification specified for the Programme. However, for equivalence of the qualification of the candidate reference may be made to Booklet "Equivalence of Foreign Degrees" published by Association of Indian University. In case the Degree/Certificate possessed by the candidate is in a language other than English or Hindi, a translated copy duly verified by the concerned Embassy should be submitted.
- b. The fees once paid will neither be refunded nor transferred. However, in cases where University denies admission, the programme fee will be refunded through A/c Payee Cheque only.



- c. The student needs to submit NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE from the concerned embassy. In the letter it should be clearly written that the Embassy has no objection regarding study of the concerned student in IGNOU as well as extension of visa from time to time. PIO / OCI Card holders are not required to submit the NOC from concerned Embassy.
- d. PIO/OCI card holders and also Refugees (UNCHR) Card Holders will pay the fee applicable to International Students.

## 12.24 Change of Category

Please note that any request for change of category code shall not be entertained by the University after finalization of admissions. Similarly, for the entrance test based and merit based programmes, request for change of category will not be entertained once the Forms are finally submitted by the prospective learners.

## 12.25 Correction/Change of Name/Surname of Learner

Spelling mistakes, if any, committed at the time of data entry stage will be rectified at the Regional Centre and corrected data transmitted to Student Registration Division for updating in the database. However, Learners are expected to write their correct name (as indicated in the High School Certificate) in the Admission Form. In case any change in the name (other than the one mentioned in his/her High School Certificate), then it is mandatory for the prospective learners to furnish legal evidence of having changed his/her name/ surname while submitting the admission form.

For Change of Name/Surname, after confirmation of admission, the learners are required to submit the following documents at the Regional Centre, for onward transmission to Registrar, SRD:

- a) Original copy of Notification in a daily newspaper notifying the change of name;
- b) Affidavit, in original, on non-judicial Stamp Paper of the appropriate value sworn in before 1st Class Magistrate specifying the change in the name;
- c) Marriage Card/Marriage Certificate in case of women candidates for change in surname;
- d) Gazette Notification, in original, reflecting the change of name/surname;
- e) Demand Draft of Rs.500/- drawn in favour of IGNOU payable at New Delhi.

**Request for correction and/or change of Name / Surname will be entertained only before award of the Degree/Diploma/Certificate. ## 12.26 Disputes on Admission & other University Matters

The University takes appropriate administrative and disciplinary measures for smooth functioning of its day-to-day operations in accordance with the prevailing rules and guidelines. In case of disputes on Admission and other University Matters, the place of jurisdiction of filing of law suit, if necessary, will be New Delhi/Delhi ONLY.

## 12.27 Recognition of IGNOU Programmes

The degrees awarded by IGNOU are recognized by UGC. The details are available at <http://ignou.ac.in/ignou/aboutignou/division/srd/Recognition>

IGNOU Degrees/Diplomas/Certificates are recognized by all member universities of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and are at par with Degrees/Diplomas/ Certificates of all Indian Universities/ Institutions, as per UGC Circular letter No.F.1-52/2000 (CPP-II) dated 5<sup>th</sup> May, 2004.

## 12.28 KVS Employees

As per the agreement with Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS), One hundred students are entitled to get 50% fee concession in the programmes offered by the University during a year. All the KVS employees seeking admission may send their applications alongwith the requisite full programme fee directly to the Concerned Regional Centres without routing through IGNOU HQs. However the employees may follow the rules and procedures laid down by the KVS HQs, New Delhi, as regards to obtaining permission etc. The reimbursement in fees of 50% will be made only to such candidates duly

recommended by the KVS HQs to SRD, IGNOU HQs. The reimbursement will be made by the concerned Regional Centre of IGNOU, on getting the communication only from Student Registration Division (SRD), IGNOU HQs.

### प्रेस नोट

राष्ट्रभाषा हिन्दी के प्रचार-प्रसार और विकास की दिशा में स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं का महत्वपूर्ण योगदान रहा है। स्वतंत्रता प्राप्ति के बाद इन संस्थाओं में हिन्दी तर क्षेत्रों में हिन्दी को लोकप्रिय बनाने के लिए काफी प्रयत्न किये हैं। इसी परिप्रेक्ष्य में कुछ स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं द्वारा संचालित हिन्दी परीक्षाओं को भारत सरकार में मान्यता प्रदान की है। ताकि लोगों को हिन्दी का ज्ञान हो सके और इसके माध्यम से रोजगार प्राप्त कर सके। भारत सरकार ने हिन्दी शिक्षा समिति की सिफारिश और संघ लोक सेवा आयोग की सहमति से इन संस्थाओं द्वारा आयोजित कुछ परीक्षाओं को 1960 से मान्यता देना शुरू किया ताकि इन परीक्षाओं को पास करने पर उम्मीदवार उन सरकारी नौकरियों के लिए पात्र बन सकें, जिनके लिए हिन्दी की योग्यता भी जारी की गई है। इस विषय पर कई प्रेस विज्ञप्तियाँ भी जारी की गई हैं। समय-समय पर अस्थायी मान्यता की अवधि भी बढ़ाई जाती रही है। बाद में कुछ संस्थाओं की परीक्षाओं को स्थायी मान्यता दी गई है। यद्यपि अभी कुछ संस्थाओं को अस्थायी मान्यता दी गई है।

हिन्दी शिक्षा समिति भारत सरकार में एक स्थायी संस्था है। यह समिति हिन्दी के प्रचार, प्रसार और विकास के संबंध में भारत सरकार को समय-समय पर सलाह देती है और सिफारिशें करती है। इस समिति की सिफारिशों के आधार पर स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं की परीक्षाओं को मान्यता प्रदान की जाती है।

किसी भी स्वैच्छिक संस्था को चाहे वह स्वयं हिन्दी की परीक्षा आयोजित करती हो, या किसी भी मान्यताप्राप्त अन्य स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्था के माध्यम से परीक्षा संचालित करती हो, मान्यताप्राप्त करने के लिए अखिल भारतीय हिन्दी संस्था संघ, 24, कोटला मार्ग, नई दिल्ली की मान्यता के लिए प्रस्ताव भेजना होता है। इस प्रस्ताव के आधार पर संस्था संघ परीक्षा की मान्यता संबंधी मानदण्डों और नियमों के अनुसार उस संस्था का निरीक्षण करता है और मान्यता के लिए मंत्रालय को अपनी सिफारिश भेजता है। इसके बाद मंत्रालय का अधीनस्थ कार्यालय केन्द्रीय हिन्दी निदेशालय की एक निरीक्षण समिति स्वतंत्र रूप से उस संस्था का निरीक्षण बनती है और अपनी रिपोर्ट हिन्दी शिक्षा समिति के विचार के लिए मंत्रालय की प्रस्तुत करती है।

कुल समाचार पत्रों में परीक्षा शीर्षक के अधीन यह समाचार छपा होता है कि हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन प्रयाग (इलाहाबाद) की प्रथमा और मध्यमा परीक्षा को क्रमशः एस.एस.सी. और बी.ए. के समकक्ष मान्यता दी गई है। इस प्रकार के समाचार का स्पष्टीकरण इस मंत्रालय से समय-समय पर दिया जाता रहा है। कुछ वर्ष पहले उपशिक्षा मंत्री, श्री पी.के. थुंगन ने भी लोकसभा में स्थिति स्पष्ट की थी और बताया था कि हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन की वास्तविक स्थिति भिन्न है क्योंकि यह एक स्वैच्छिक संगठन है न कि विश्वविद्यालय अथवा विश्वविद्यालय समझी जाने वाली संस्था। यह शिक्षा राज्य परीक्षा परिषद् तथा विश्वविद्यालय के समान नहीं माना जाता है। इसलिए इस संस्था द्वारा आयोजित इन परीक्षाओं को केन्द्र सरकार द्वारा हाईस्कूल, इंटरमीडिएट और बी.ए. के बराबर मान्यता नहीं दी गई है। इस संस्था को केवल हिन्दी विषय की परीक्षा को संचालित करने की मान्यता दी गई है, भले ही, यह हिन्दी के साथ-साथ अन्य विषयों को भी तैयार करता हो।

पुनः यह स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि किसी पद के लिए निर्धारित किए गए हिन्दी स्तर के निर्धारण के प्रयोजन से हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन की प्रथमा और मध्यमा परीक्षाओं को क्रमशः एस.एस.एल.सी. तथा बी.ए. के बराबर से मान्यता दी गई है।

पुनः यह स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि किसी पद के लिए निर्धारित किए गए हिन्दी स्तर के निर्धारण के प्रयोजन से हिन्दी साहित्य सम्मेलन की प्रथमा और मध्यमा परीक्षाओं को क्रमशः एस.ए इसी प्रकार अन्य स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं द्वारा संचालित हिन्दी परीक्षाओं की मान्यता के बारे में भी कहा जा सकता है किये परीक्षाएँ न तो किसी राज्य परीक्षा परिषद् और नहीं विश्वविद्यालय के समकक्ष मानी गई हैं। जहाँ तक सरकारी नौकरियों के लिए इन परीक्षाओं की मान्यता का प्रश्न है, इस सम्बन्ध में यह निश्चय किया गया है किये दि सरकारी अथवा गैर सरकारी कार्यालय, अर्धसरकारी संस्थाया शैक्षिक संस्था में किसी पद के लिए हिन्दी की कोई विशेष योग्यता निर्धारित की गई है तो इन परीक्षाओं से प्राप्त की गई योग्यताधारी व्यक्ति इन पदों के पात्र हो सकते हैं। परन्तु हिन्दी की अलग से यदि कोई योग्यता निर्धारित नहीं की गई है तो स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्था से प्रमाण पत्र या डिग्री प्राप्त करने वाले व्यक्ति विश्वविद्यालय या राज्य परीक्षा परिषदों के प्रमाण पत्र या डिग्री की समकक्षता का दावा नहीं कर सकते हैं। स.एल.सी. तथा बी.ए. के बराबर से मान्यता दी गई है।

अतः उपर्युक्त विवरण के आधार पर, संक्षेप में पुनः स्पष्ट किया जाता है कि स्वैच्छिक हिन्दी संस्थाओं की मान्यता केवल संलग्न सूची में दर्शायी गई समकक्ष परीक्षा के लिए निर्धारित हिन्दी स्तर तक ही सीमित है और इसे पूर्ण प्रमाण-पत्र या डिग्री परीक्षा के बरोबर नहीं माना जायगा। आम जानकारी के लिए संस्थावार मान्यताओं का विवरण संलग्न है।

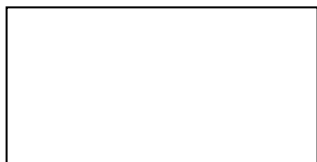
